Mr. Losee went on to say he felt sorry for Mr. Babb. A roll call vote was taken voting yea were; Clark, Sigreto, Greiner, Madsen and Sain; voting nay were Losee and Rose. Motion carried 5-2.

2. **Motion** – by Losee/Rose to approve the Resolution 2016-004 to permit opening a bank account with PNC to receive and disburse funds from the Wade Trust Account. Passed without dissent.

3. Motion - by Madsen/Greiner to approve the job description for the Borough Zoning/Code

Enforcement Officer. Passed without dissent.

4. **Motion** by Sigreto/Rose to hire staff for the summer program in the park (Ciera Cavallaro, Erin McNeeley, Madeleine Yost and Nicoletta Cuccio). Passed without dissent.

5. **Motion** by Losee/Greiner to allow a group to meet for the National Day of Prayer in front of the Borough Hall on Thursday 5 May 2016 at 0900 hrs. Passed without dissent.

6. Mr. Rose asked Mr. Greiner what the schedule was to sweep the gravel from the borough street corners. Mr. Rose also referred a code enforcement question for review and action to Mr. Fitch

7. Mr. Madsen brought up a discussion item concerning record storage for the Borough and the fact that we are out of room in the Borough Building and we needed to explore digitizing the records or look for a secure offsite storage area. Mrs. Drake also noted that she had 20 years of tax records in her home office.

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8. Mayor Clark requested the Council approve closing part of Avenue I and First Street to hold a block party on 17 September to celebrate the Borough Hall's Centennial Celebration. Motion by Rose/Clark passed without dissent.
